I'm a researcher at the USC School of Cinematic Arts, and I have a paper coming out in *Frontiers in Neuroscience* this month on ways that readers can use the literary environment to influence their reading experiences. Before that, though, I'd like to note that having seen some very unpleasant crap floating around online about what other people are reading, and also having now read a paper and excerpted news item about research on "book sharing" (which is used to mean "shopping online for books you already have in your home library") in the journal of a magazine called *Future Tense*, I'd like to report that the worst you might find is what I call "book snobbery": Using half-understood or poorly understood or grudgingly accepted scientific "facts" about book-sharing as justification for staying home and not doing some much-needed, more pleasurable, life-affirming thing like shopping for a food to eat, a restaurant to go to, a new haircut, or a new outfit. Book snobbery is much worse than anything you might imagine. It's when an author or a friend calls you on the telephone, or sends you an email, and says, with a tone that implies that she herself has a working knowledge of the literature, and that she is also a person of taste and discernment, "You should read Book X by Author Y. It's so incredibly smart and insightful and brilliantly written. I know you'll love it!" And the fear is that you're not even sure you'll like it. What's even more alarming is how much money and intellectual horsepower and thought is being put into trying to make this whole book-sharing thing something about which we can all be, as I put it in the paper, "super-concerned." This includes (but is not limited to) the following: New studies about "the glut of books online" Studies about how books-in-the-cloud services like Amazon's Kindle Fire, e-reader apps for iPhones and iPads and Android phones, and the e-reader apps for books you already have in your house are "suppressing" sales of paper books New studies about how, when used with the books in your home library, "lending" apps like Good 82157476af
